

Project Background

This project was part of a larger scheme with Enfield Council to renovate streets and pavements in the centre Enfield into more people-friendly streetscapes after the pandemic and subsequent lockdowns.

As we believe strongly in the power of urban regeneration, and find nothing more fun than creating new, bespoke designs, this was an exciting project that we were keen to get to work on. demonstrating a more playful and creative side to thermoplastic road and playground markings!





this The concept for streetscape was large chalkboard, featuring playground with moveable street furniture, and more relevant to us, some fun large connect-the-dot characters that children could interact with and fill in with chalk.

Due to the nature of the installation, parts of the artwork were already drawn, such as the heads and faces of the characters, along with the numbered dots to be connected with chalk in order to complete to drawings.

Enfield Council (client) Jan Kattein Architects (designers + photos) Our ability to manufacture the bespoke markings in thermoplastic to the original design was key; when sent the files, and we could easily and quickly convert this into CAD format ready for manufacture.

We manufacture our thermoplastic material from scratch, so we know that the material lasts for around 8-10 years depending on how heavily it is used, an important factor when looking to install a permanent or semi-permanent art installation.

We could also remove faded existing road markings, allowing the new markings to stand out clearly on the ground.





Due to the more complex nature of the installation, we knew that there could be issues getting the work to look like the original design, so we manufactured extra copies of certain tricky parts and pieces, ensuring that there were plenty of backups if anything had to be redone.

However, this was not an issue, as the installation team was easily able to lay down the material in place by eye and burn it into the ground with little issue - but it's always good to be prepared in situations like this!
